<p><b><u>Set starting point - Marine life</u></b></p> <p>This module will form internal Unit 1 of the AQA GCSE Component 1 Portfolio submission. The length of time will be 22 weeks spent exploring the theme. The unit will help students to appreciate and contextualise the longer GCSE project and its format preparing them for the Self Directed units to follow. <p>This term students will continue developing and refining their compositional designs through to completing a painted or otherwise response to their chosen topic. In all cases students must respond to 2 or more artists.</p> <p>This Final response will be produced during the PPE in November.</p> <p>The main assessment objectives focussed on, though not exclusively, are:</p> <p>AO2: Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.</p> <p>AO4: Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language.</p>	<p>This module will form Component 2 (externally set assignment). Students respond to one starting point carefully selected from a range on starting points provided by AQA. This personal response should provide evidence of the student's ability to work independently within, realise intentions that are personal and meaningful and explicitly address the requirements of all four assessment objectives previously mentioned in this document.</p> <p>Students should then demonstrate the ability to use a broad range of the Fine Art techniques selected from those previously mentioned in this document.</p>	<p>Students produce a Final response produced during the Final GCSE 10 hour Exam in April. In most cases this is a large painting, often on canvas.</p>
