
Activity One: Get To Know Your House!

V	VOICE IS CLEAR	I speak clearly in class, and make interesting and helpful contributions when it is my turn. I only speak at appropriate times to allow everyone to focus or their own learning.
E	ENGAGED IN ACTIVITIES	I take part in all activities, on my own or contributing in a group. I follow instructions without distracting others, and challenge myself to complete all tasks to the very best of my ability. I remain focused, and complete excellen work both in school and at home.
S	SUBJECT SPECIALIST	I use subject specialist vocabulary when speaking and writing, showing that understand the importance of using appropriate academic language to communicate at school.


Excellence - Being the best version of YOU.
